WHAT DOES THE SPIRIT TELL YOU? The Holy Spirit teaches us to see with the eyes of Christ, to live life as Christ lived, to understand life as Christ understood it. I'm Catholic - Theology for the common man. (3) Paschal Triduum

Lent culminates in Holy Week where the details of the celebration of the salvific works of Jesus Christ are realized. It tries to follow the chronology of events registered by the Gospels. Here, the focus is on three days during which salvation was accomplished: Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and the Vigil of the Resurrection, which constitute a single major feast called the Paschal Triduum. Let's analyze this more closely.

Hosanna to the Son of David

Of the thirty three years of Jesus Christ's life, three were of public proclamation and the last weekend was the most important. This started with the day we call Palm Sunday. Jesus came to Jerusalem, the religious center of the world, to die as an example of the great prophets of Israel leaving a message of salvation. The commencement of events was prepared following a specific custom: an untied colt served here as a medium of transportation. Selection of the animal was particular. According to the prophecy of Hosea, the Messiah as a royal descendant of David had to ride on an untied young donkey. A special atmosphere was felt by the crowd who came to the feast of Passover. The people, proclaiming the coming of the Son of David, spread their cloaks and palms on the road over which the Prophet passed. One could really feel an extraordinary atmosphere which announced the coming of something unusual. The people started to realize the beginning of the prophetic events of salvation. The disciples of Jesus, as John noticed from the beginning didn't realize this until the resurrection. The gathering crowd which welcomed Him did not realize this either.

Weekly Confessions: One hour before every Mass; Every Saturday (except Holy Saturday): 3:30 pm to 4:30 pm
Penitential Celebrations: Two are celebrated each year, in Advent and in Lent.

Season of Lent: MESSAGE FROM BISHOP: Important Update on Covid-19. - March 21, 2022

With the government of Ontario lifting the Mandatory Masking Policy today, the policy direction for the Diocese of Thunder Bay will be that wearing a Mask in our churches for Mass/services or at other parish meetings or gatherings will be OPTIONAL, and will be the personal choice of each parishioner. We will respect whatever decisions are taken by our parishioners, and we will recognize everyone's right to wear or not to wear a mask. However, we encourage some social distancing to continue. During Sunday or weekday Masses, priests, deacons or other ministers of Holy Communion, must continue to sanitize their hands beforehand, and must continue to wear a mask while distributing Holy Communion at Mass or in other places. Communion from the cup is still not allowed at this time. There will be further updates about the ending of our Diocesan Vaccine Policy, which we noted initially was only to be temporary due to the pandemic. Thank you for your continued support of our diocesan policies. These are important for the safety of everyone. We encourage those who can, to once again attend Mass at their parish church, especially as we approach the celebrations of Holy Week and Easter.
