Annunciation BVM and St. Hilary Parishes are a community of Catholics under the guidance of the Holy Spirit. We proclaim the Good News of Jesus Christ through worship, service and fellowship, in cooperation with the Bishop of Thunder Bay, in order to bring forth the values of the Kingdom of God.



On this and the next two Sundays we have parables of Jesus for our meditation so it would be good to remember the special characteristics of parabolic teaching.

1. Parables are wisdom teaching. By reading them we get a new insight into life – e.g. parenting, friendship, leadership, spiritual guidance, etc.

2. They teach by way of paradox. Things that we thought to be opposed turn out to be both

true, and taken together reveal the new insight mentioned above. We must always be on the look out for a surprise in a parable therefore – an unexpected turn of events, something being praised that we would not normally consider praiseworthy. If we follow this up, the parable ends up challenging our values or the dominant values of our culture.

3. Parables are stories and we are invited to enter into their movement. At a certain point the story comes to a climax – the moment when we experience the surprise mentioned above. Note that the climactic moment will be different for different readers and for us at different times in our lives. The parable of the sower is one of Jesus' greatest, not merely for its content, but as a masterpiece of imaginative teaching. The conclusion of the meditation is twofold – how deep! and, what a great teacher!

Lord, we thank you for the many wonderful things that our eyes can see and our ears can hear:

- that you created men and women as equal partners;
- that the human family is called to live in harmony;
- that the Church of Jesus Christ is the Church of the poor;
- that all the baptized are fully members of the Church.

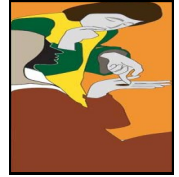

Let us remember this well: bring part of the Church means being united to Christ and receiving from him the divine life that makes us live as Christmas; it means staying united to the pope and

to the bishops who are instruments of unity and communion; and it also means learning to overcome subjectivism and division, to understand each other better, to harmonize the variety and the richness of each person - in a word, to love God and the people beside us more, in the family, in the parish, in associations. Body and limb, in order to live, must be united! Unity is superior to conflict, always!

Reopening Churches: Welcome to the New Normal: Churches in Thunder Bay are will officially be opened next weekend with a 30% capacity of the facility. Our Annunciation Blessed Virgin Mary Parish can accommodate at least 42 participants. All participants must wear a mask, use hand sanitizer and follow the directions given to all worshippers. The directions/ guidelines will be announced prior to the Mass. There will be some masks available for those who forget. You are encouraged to wear your own masks. Hand sanitizer will be available in the church. Sunday offering is to be placed in the basket provided at the church entrance. There will be no formal collection taken during the Mass. For those who would like to participate in the weekday mass at 10:30 a.m. (at Annunciation Blessed Virgin Mary Parish) you are welcome. If you are sick, please avoid participation. Precautions: (for participation in the Mass) - please wear your masks. We may have a limited supply, provided the order arrives. Hand sanitizer is available in the church. Since there will be no cups served, for the time being we will not be requiring Eucharistic ministers during the Mass. Lectors, please follow the schedule for proclaiming the Word.
