Parishes Annunciation BVM and St. Hilary are a communities of Catholics under the guidance of the Holy Spirit. We proclaim the Good News of Jesus Christ through worship, service and fellowship, in order to bring forth the values of the Kingdom of God. It is traditional in the Church that on the 5th and 6th Sundays of the Easter season, the gospel readings are taken from the long discourse which St John tells us Jesus had with the apostles at the Last Supper, and which is recounted from chapter 13:31 to the end of chapter 17. This is very deep teaching, so you must make a special effort to experience that it is also down-to-earth, and helps you to understand your own

life. This year's first extract is the beginning of the discourse. It is in clearly distinct sections: Verses 31 and 32 are the response of Jesus to the departure of Judas. You may have difficulty interpreting the word "glorify" which occurs several times. It is a biblical term indicating the victory of God's power. It is significant that "hallowed" in the first petition of the Our Father means the same thing. In verse 33, Jesus says clearly that he is at a point in his life when he must make his journey alone. The saying is repeated and clarified in verse 36, which is not included in this passage, but which you may want to look up in a Bible. In verses 34 and 35 the commandment of love – which is the dominant theme of the last discourse – is enunciated for the first time. Read the verses carefully, letting them touch you as if you were reading them for the first time.

If the theme of new creation, new life through baptism is to be explored and given back its 'saltiness' then the homily and the rest of the ritual need to gel together.
