The image we have of the Ascension is that of departing, going away, disappearing; but our belief as Christians is that it represents the silent presence of Christ everywhere in the universe. He is no longer limited by earthly conditions — to be in one place at one time in his presence to his followers — but now dwells in the heavens with the Father: present in every gathering of his people — so he is present among us now, present whenever his people are in need, present in hearts calling us to be disciples and to be his hands, and feet, and voice in our lives. To celebrate this feast today is not to recall a past event — that day long ago 'when he went up to heaven' — but to rejoice that Jesus is our living Lord, with us now, leading and guiding us, because he is

not tied down to a moment in earthly history.

The Ascension of Jesus was an essential stage in his relationship with his followers. He had walked with them in their moments of strength and of weakness, and now he was leaving them. It is, of course, significant that this moment occurred immediately after his apparent defeat and after they had betrayed him. By meditating on the story, we discover similar moments in our own relationship with God, with a cause, or with people who have touched our lives.

KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS.

Ascension Day is the Christian celebration of Jesus rising into Heaven after He had spent 40 days on Earth after the Resurrection. Ascension Day is celebrated forty days

after Easter Sunday on Ascension Thursday.

This date is also ten days before the celebration of the Pentecost. The belief is that Jesus died on Good Friday from the cross on Earth for forty days, teaching His followers about the Kingdom of Heaven.



The fortieth day, Jesus was eating, drinking and speaking among His followers. At this time, Jesus had “commanded” His disciples “that they should not depart from Jerusalem, but should wait for the promise of the Father, which you have heard (saith he) by my mouth.” After all was spoken to His followers, Acts 1:9 states “And when he had said these things, while they looked on, he was raised up: and a cloud received him out of their sight.”

Why we celebrate Ascension Day? Ascension Day is a Christian holiday celebrated according to the New Testament, when Jesus Christ preached to his disciples 40 days after his resurrection. It is believed that on the 40th day he took them to the Mount of Olives, where they watched him ascend to heaven. Ascension Day is the end of Easter. Depending on the phases of the moon in a particular year, the day of Ascension is celebrated on Thursday. But some churches, especially in the United States, celebrate Ascension Day next Sunday. Eastern Orthodox churches calculate the date of Easter according to the Julian calendar, and not according to the Gregorian, so they have Ascension Day after the celebration in the west.
